

**St. Luke's Lutheran Church Council Meeting**  
Tuesday, May 16, 2017

Lauren Orcutt read the St. Luke's Mission Statement.

**Call to Order:**

The meeting was called to order by President, Paul Maki at 7:05pm. Pastor Hoppman opened with prayer, remembering the various needs of the congregation.

**Approval of Minutes:**

Motion to approve the April 18, 2017 Minutes by Peggy Moser, seconded by Faith Thomas. Minutes approved.

**Treasurer's Report:**

Carolyn's reviewed the most recent Treasurer's Report:  
Currently, we are in the black.  
Check received from San Juan Unified School District in the amount of \$3,850.00 for use of the facility.  
Checkbook balance: \$36,410.45

**Pastor's Report:** Written report on file

**Snyod Assembly Report:**

Pastor Hoppman reviewed the highlights of his recent activities: Pastor and Holly attended Synod Assembly in Fresno. Pastor especially enjoyed the keynote speaker, who has been quite involved in immigration concerns. He stated that "Moses was the first wetback", as he crossed the Nile river and he wasn't supposed to, and went from a very impoverished situation, into a situation of privilege.

Pastor also indicated that the Synod passed a resolution that indicates it

will be sensitive and helpful to congregations as we deal with sanctuary movements and situations.

Holly reported on two resolutions that were passed at the Synod Assembly meeting: 1. Guidelines on payment to visiting pastors; 2. Making a new division task force for Peacebuilding in the United States.

Holly has written a report in the June News & views further explaining these resolutions. This information is also on the Synod website.

### **More from Pastor:**

Pastor stated when he first started in the ministry, a friend told him that the most important thing that a pastor can do, is have significant interaction with people; it is what really matters, keeping strong connection, showing concern”.

Two Con Calling underway – there is an incredible group of callers helping out with this project. Callers are focusing on folks who have missed two Sundays in a row. He expounded further on this thought and attached a sheet explaining in detail how the program works.

Confirmation and Adult Bible studies finished for the Spring. In the Fall, the Adult Bible study will study “*On The Freedom of a Christian*”, a seminal treatise of Martin Luther written in 1520.

Six people ready to be received as members on June 11<sup>th</sup>.

### **Meyer Fund:**

Flooring project is underway, pews were moved, passed the asbestos test, tile went in. Jack has filled out Form 1000’s for payment to the contractors. Holly Hoppman stated that the benevolence checks have been prepared to send out to those agreed upon by the Council and the congregation.

Pastor stated that in the letter accompanying the check, a note should be included stating that this is part of our tithe from the memorial gift, and we are thankful to share. Pastor and Holly will draft the letter.

Pastor mentioned that it has been suggested by a member of the congregation that the communion rail be “strengthened” in a certain way that he described to members of the Board of Worship and Music. Discussed at Council meeting, and the Council voted against his proposal unanimously. Pastor stated that while we appreciate his concern and time,

It is not the direction we feel it should go. President Maki will discuss with the individual and let him know of the Council's decision.

**Finance Board/Special Funds Report:** No Written Report on file  
David Saxby was absent. President Maki reviewed the report.  
Attendance was up for the month of April.

Pastor stated that Lauren has been busy looking for “flutter flags” and perfecting the message to go on them, and he would like to purchase 8 “flutter flags” to display around the church; 5 flutter flags on Center Parkway, and 3 flutter flags on Tangerine every Sunday morning and then taken in – to make sure they last for a while. He proposes to use the Lay memorial which is \$1425.00, and the Landaker memorial which is \$405.00, and add some of the \$25.00 memorials, for approximately \$2,000.00.
