With infinite love, he granted the people your life.

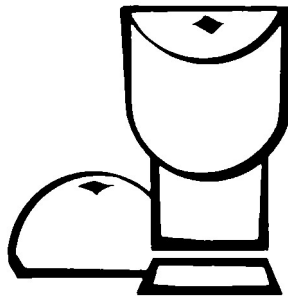
In the night in which he was betrayed,
