

#### FINANCES TO DATE



The graph above compares the year-to-date figures for the Budget, Incomes, and Expenses, as of the end of August 2024. As shown, the current Incomes exceed the Budget by about \$15,000. The Incomes without the Reserve supplement (\$141,400) exceed the Expenses (\$92,029) by about \$49,400. This is primarily due to not having the expenses of a pastor. We are currently not dependent on the Reserve supplement to meet expenses, which is our goal. With your continued financial support and the efforts of our Call Committee, we look forward to identifying, selecting, and calling a new pastor.
