



### St. Luke's 2024 W-ELCA Fall Festival

This year's Fall Festival was another success. The weather was perfect. I am hopeful the guests and members of the congregation who dropped in found fun and unique treasures, found something needed or found something that satisfied a sweet tooth and/or a hungry stomach. The proceeds from this event are currently an amazing \$3,229.78 after the expenses identified so far. Last year's total was \$2,952.38. In 2025, these proceeds will give the St. Luke's W-ELCA group the ability to spread a needed abundance of generosity among the Charities they support.

Another important component of and blessing from this year's Fall Festival is the opportunity it provided our Church to support the surrounding local community in so many different ways. For example, there were a couple of returning vendors from nearby Faith Communities who had a venue here to raise funds that are directly used to support their programs that target the unhoused and children. Sherrita Carter from Tabernacle of Prayer and Praise Church, who uses our facility for their Services on Sundays, sold several of a Children's book she wrote that was recently published. Two young adult sisters who live in the nearby neighborhood and are just starting their new business had a booth selling scented candle melts and other gifts. A couple of ladies who also live in the nearby neighborhood each had a booth one selling beautiful handmade jewelry and the other selling hats, clothing and other gifts. There was even a vendor who grew up very close to St. Luke's and has fond memories because she was married at the Church several years ago. Finally, a local thrift retailer Bargain World was supported via the donation of the remaining White Elephants. And, the remaining books were donated to the Book Den which is affiliated with the Sacramento Public Library. In addition to public sales events, The Book

Den donates books to local schools, children's programs and senior living facilities.

Thank you so much again this year to everyone who contributed so much by helping manage or volunteer at the White Elephant, Boutique, Country Store, Food booth and donation bucket tables, by helping setup and cleanup and of course for all of your wonderful donations. And, a special call out to the Kiwanis Key Club Kids who helped with setup, cleanup, did facepainting for our guests with Kids as well as "Kids at Heart" and helped Kirsten sell the hotdog lunch.

Their services include family advocacy and support; behavioral and mental health services; substance use prevention and treatment; juvenile justice intervention; mentoring; foster care; adoption services and pre- and post- adoption services.

To help the families they serve, the organization offers a "gift shop" to the caregivers where they can select appropriate and meaningful gifts for the children in their care. Our contributions help stock the gift shop. If you would like to participate, please bring your unwrapped gifts, and place them under the tree at the back of the sanctuary by December 8.


#### **Comments:**

#### **FINANCES TO DATE**



The graph above compares the year-to-date figures for the Budget, Incomes, and Expenses, as of the end of September 2024. As shown, the current Incomes exceed the Budget by about \$12,700. The budgeted transfer from Reserves (\$900) did not occur until after September 30. The Incomes without the Reserve supplement (\$155,569) exceed the Expenses (\$103,378) by about \$52,000. This is primarily due to not having the expenses of a pastor. We are currently not dependent on the Reserve supplement to meet expenses, which is our goal. With your continued financial support and the efforts of our Call Committee, we look forward to identifying, selecting, and calling a new pastor.


