SSYAF's services include family advocacy and peer support; behavioral and mental health services; substance use prevention and treatment; juvenile justice intervention; mentoring; foster care, adoption services, and pre- and post- adoption services.

During the holiday season SSYAF offers a Holiday Store to the families its serves so that caregivers can "shop" at no cost to them and select appropriate and meaningful gifts for the children in their care. Our contributions will help stock the Holiday Store and provide special moments of holiday connection for these families. 

October was the second consecutive month, since August, that the monthly offerings fell short of the Budget.


The good news is that year-to-date offerings remain above the Budget.

# **FINANCES TO DATE**



The graph above compares the year-to-date figures for the Budget, Incomes, and Expenses, as of the end of October 2024. As shown, the current Incomes exceed the Budget by about \$12,900. The Incomes without the Reserve supplement (\$170,466) exceed the Expenses (\$111,851) by about \$58,600. This is primarily due to not having the expenses of a pastor over the last few months. We are currently not dependent on the Reserve supplement to meet expenses, which is our goal.
