You are invited to stand as able. CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS


All may make the sign of the cross, the sign that is marked at baptism, as the presiding minister begins.

An offering is received for the mission of the church.



OFFERING PRAYER



Let us proclaim the mystery of faith: Christ has died. Christ has risen. Christ will come again.


With this bread and cup... We look with hope for his coming. **Come, Lord Jesus.**
