


Pastoral Perspective


March offerings were outstanding! In part because there were five Sundays (including Easter Sunday) and several quarterly contributions.

FINANCES TO DATE



To supplement the Financial Secretary's report on contributions, the Finance Board provides the graph above that compares the year-to-date figures for the Budget, Incomes, and Expenses, as of the end of March 2024. As shown, the Incomes without the Reserve supplement (\$56,186) exceed the Expenses (\$43,572) by about \$12,600. This is partially due to receipts from two facility use patrons (Visions in Education and County Primary Voting Center). Also, the difference between Budget (\$49,410) and Expenses (\$43,572) is, as previously reported, primarily due to not having a full-time pastor. As previously presented, our goal is to increase our incomes (offerings, facility usage, etc.) such that we are no longer dependent on the Reserve supplement to meet expenses.
