# 25<sup>th</sup> Annual Fireworks Sale June 28th –July 4th 2024



We'll be on the list of available booths so we'll again use the scanners and tablets to process the sales. Let your friends and family know to shop online and then just a quick visit to our booth to pick up their fireworks! Super easy and convenient.

Lastly, we will have T-Shirts this year, but I had to pre-order them (just one style). So I ordered a couple of each size, so first come, first served!



### **FINANCES TO DATE**



To supplement the Financial Secretary's report on contributions, the Finance Board provides the graph above that compares the year-to-date figures for the Budget, Incomes, and Expenses, as of the end of April 2024. As shown, the Incomes without the Reserve supplement (\$72,947) exceed the Expenses (\$55,725) by about \$17,200. This is partially due to past receipts from two facility use patrons and a slight increase in offerings (quarterly donations) in April. Also, the difference between Budget (\$67,730) and Expenses (\$55,725) is, as previously reported, primarily due to not having a full-time pastor. Our goal is to increase our incomes (offerings, facility usage, etc.) such that we are no longer dependent on the Reserve supplement to meet expenses.
