

BLESSED TO BE A BLESSING is the theme for our 100th Anniversary year-long celebration and was introduced at our Kick-off celebration on June 9. We had a delightful picnic followed by a congregational Jeopardy game that helped us get more familiar with possible service opportunities.

At the Kick-off members were asked to privately commit to providing 100 "blessings" to an organization or social concern that you feel strongly about in the upcoming year. The blessings can be in the form of money, time, supplies, acts of kindness or prayer. If you would like suggestions of what you can do, there is a board of information from several agencies next to the mustard tree in the sanctuary. You can also commit to helping an individual if you prefer. Perhaps you have an elderly neighbor who struggles to put out the garbage or take care of their yard. Perhaps your local elementary school needs tutors for children who need help with reading or math. Perhaps your local park could use a clean-up. The idea is to pick something important to you and contribute some of your resources to it.

Our goal is to provide 10,000 blessings in the upcoming 12 months. 100 commitments x 100 resources = 10,000 blessings. We will use the mustard tree in the sanctuary to track our progress by placing flowers on the tree as the commitments are fulfilled. You do not need to prove what you have done. Your commitment is between you and God. There is a basket of flowers next to the tree in the sanctuary. When you are ready, clip a flower in the leaves of the tree. We hope to have 100 flowers on our tree by June of 2025.



FINANCES TO DATE



To supplement the Financial Secretary's report on contributions, the Finance Board provides the graph above that compares the year-to-date figures for the Budget, Incomes, and Expenses, as of the end of May 2024. As shown, the Incomes without the Reserve supplement (\$85,229) exceed the Expenses (\$64,869) by about \$20,360. This is primarily due to not having an interim/term or full-time pastor and reflected in the difference between Budget (\$84,200) and Expenses (\$64,869). Our goal is to increase our incomes (offerings, facility usage, etc.) such that we are no longer dependent on the Reserve supplement to meet expenses.
