Pastoral Perspective

Jesus had an amazing way of relating with folks who were on the outskirts of society or looked down on by others. He accepted them as they were even though they had life styles or behaviors of which he didn't approve. In fact, Jesus was known as "a friend of sinners".

It is a reality that Jesus accepts those whom others would simply try their best to keep away from. The question, then, that hits us in the face is "How can we reject and ignore those whom Jesus loves and accepts?"

Maybe we have the wrong idea about this acceptance business. True, Jesus accepted the prostitutes and adulterers, but he didn't approve of what they were doing. True, Jesus accepted the tax-collectors and others who took advantage of their own people for financial gain, but he didn't approve of their dishonesty and cheating. When Jesus is described as "a friend of sinners" this doesn't mean he puts his stamp of approval on sinfulness and immorality. Acceptance and approval are two different things.

Jesus knew a meaningful relationship has to begin with acceptance. Without acceptance there is no loving concern, just cold judgment. Any kind of helpful relationship between people begins with recognizing and affirming the common bond of humanity between ourselves and others. Jesus willingly and lovingly did that. That really is what the miracle of God becoming human is all about.

If I am going to minister to you, I must meet you where you are. If you are going to minister to me, you must do the same. This is the way Jesus ministered with folks. He didn't hide from folks or keep away from them. He interacted with them in love.

Jesus demonstrated what acceptance means and what it does. It opens the way to sharing love. Acceptance is really love's first word. It is the foundation of loving deeds that follow. Jesus shows us the way that works. He shows us a kind of love that can change our lives and the lives of others for good.

What then are we to do? First, let's receive and give thanks for Jesus' acceptance and love given graciously to us and then, in his power, show acceptance and love to our fellow sinful brothers and sisters in this world.

The reason I like the Wednesday Bible Study and Potlucks, is because I love spending time with fellow believers in the faith, plus, there's nothing like Lutheran potlucks...such yummy dishes are displayed for our enjoyment!

Also, this summer, the study of Luther's work is enhanced by the weekly videos which portray Martin and Katie in little household "situations".

There are also videos of various presenters, i.e., a Professor Emeritus of Church History at Luther Seminary in St. Paul, Minnesota, an Assistant Professor of Philosophy and Religion, and a Professor of Systematic Theology at Wartburg Seminary in Iowa. These short videos are great, and help explain things that we, as lay folks might come across in our study.

The evening begins with prayer, sometimes we sing a hymn, and then Pastor Carl directs our attention to the chapter in the Lutheran Handbook, which will be our focus for the evening. There's a section called "Church Stuff", about things like "How to Get to Know Your Pastor", "How to Respond When Someone Sits in Your Pew", "How to Receive Communion", and many other interesting titles.

In addition, there is a Course Workbook, with various "sessions" such as "How to Tell the Difference Between the Law and the Gospel", "Five things You Should know About the Lutheran Reformation", and "The Three Most Rebellious Things Jesus Did". (Our video presentation on the 16th touched on this one.) The back of the handbook says in part, "Following Jesus is hard enough without having to navigate the rocky terrain of church culture all by yourself".



"FRIENDS & FAMILY SUNDAY"



24th Annual Fireworks Sale

...and on the 8th day, they rested...

First, I want to personally thank everyone who went above and beyond to help out at the booth, especially since I wasn't able to stay the whole day. Having all of you to assist, made my comings

and goings a whole lot easier.

Ok, sales. Not a bad year, but not a great year. We made the decision to move the booth from the Mack and Valley Hi location to the church grounds. This proved a lot more convenient for all. Even though we had a couple of HOT days (including a 109 degree day), we were a whole lot more comfortable with the church amenities readily available. The location was safe, secure, and our days were shorter with not having to deliver and return fireworks from the TNT warehouse each and every day!

For the numbers, we sold just over \$21,000. A little lower sales this year, so we may adjust the location of the booth next year to help with visibility. Also, with price increases and the unfortunate proliferation of illegal fireworks, many customers just stayed home. And the last time July 4th was on a Tuesday, it was also a much lower sales year. So, after paying for expenses (fireworks, taxes, permits and stuff), we'll put just over \$7,077 in the bank to help the Property Board with the work they do here in keeping the church facilities in tip-top shape! Of that total, 10% will go to the Community Concerns Board to be shared for benevolence.

It was good to see all the crafters who took up residence at the booth for the week – knitting, looming, jewelry making – all kinds of craft work going on! We had an abundance of volunteers who helped out by providing food, water, snacks, drinks, other tangible or monetary donations, selling or buying fireworks, setting up or taking down the booth, signage, and those who spread the word to stop on by and visit us. And food, always good food arriving. No one goes hungry at the booth! We always have a great time working at the booth because it's always nice to meet the new faces, welcome our returning customers, and to watch the excitement in the kids' faces. That's the best part, the fellowship and fun we share with our neighbors and friends.


Comments:

FINANCES TO DATE



To supplement the Financial Secretary's report on contributions, the Finance Board provides the graph above that compares the year-to-date figures for the Budget, Incomes, and Expenses, as of the end of July 2023. As shown, the Incomes without the Reserve and Fireworks supplement (\$113,671) exceed the Expenses (\$107,015) which follows the quarterly giving pattern and probable annual giving contribution received in July. Donations/Incomes for the next couple of months will provide a better indication as to the end of year expectations. Expenses for the year remained below Budgeted Funds when the supplemental Reserve and Fireworks Funds (\$110,357) are included.
