Property Board Special Fund Account: Balance \$8,394.31. Note to Council: "With the storm drain repair and the CR 2016-1 expenses, it is expected that the PB Special Fund Account will end the year \$2,749.00 in the negative, a short-term internal loan."

Garbage disposal in church kitchen: Electrical work completed, thanks to Ben Briel's son. Purchase pending – it is believed that Jack and Jerry will install it.

All member work day 10-21. Hoping for a good turnout!

Storm drain repair: Accepted the Trenchless Co. low bid. Jack met with the company to make sure everyone is on the same page with regard to the numbers. There is still an issue with the storm drain going under one of our beautiful trees. The fate of the tree is undetermined.

Custodian employee proposal: Property Board is looking for feedback. 12 hours/week, \$10,920.00/year. This combines janitorial and limited maintenance efforts. The 12 hours per week is based on the estimated cleaning hours required each week, if the schedule is strictly followed. The

cost of a Custodian employee at is reflected in the PB 2018 budget request. A detailed draft "Custodian Duty Statement" was provided by the PB. Council: Please review and submit any comments to the PB.

A discussion ensued regarding the duties of the employee, and the time it takes to complete the necessary janitorial and maintenance work.

Cost increase is +4.3%. Security also needs to be adhered to when the custodian is on site.
