Pastoral Perspective



"...On the way they had argued with one another about who was the greatest...And he took a child and put him in the midst of them, and taking him in his arms, he said to them, 'Whoever receives one such child in my name receives me, and whoever receives me, receives not me but him who sent me."

--Mark 9:34-37

We like to feel successful. We like people to respect us and acknowledge our efforts. We get the feeling that we are successful when we get a raise or a good grade or win in some competitive game. If we can string enough successes together we can think we're pretty great.

This desire to be successful can naturally become a part of our lives as followers of Jesus. We want the Lord to respect us for what good workers we are. We want Him and others to acknowledge our efforts on His behalf. If we do enough for the Lord, we can begin to think we're pretty great.

This attitude can cause us problems in our relationship with the Lord. God might have to have a talk with us. "This is all well and good," He might say, "but you have sort of missed the point. The reason it is important for you to do all the things you do to show my love for others is because I love them. When you do anything for others in the name of my Son, you are doing my work in the world. You have to get beyond yourself to be really successful in this work.

Then anything you do, even the seemingly little things, are always successful in extending my kingdom of love."

"You see, I love you. I received you long ago when my Son died on the cross for you. Because of that there isn't anything to come between us except that you sometimes misunderstand what that means. My Son's death and resurrection means that you are accepted, I give you new life in my love. When you do something in His name, you are doing it with the realization and trust that He will make that action meaningful. Then you aren't trying to prove yourself as great. Instead, you are simply helping to further my kingdom of love."

"I guess that makes sense," we might say, "but how am I supposed to feel successful? How can I know whether I've won or lost?"

Then God might certainly respond, "Who do you think you are? I formed you out of dust. I preserve you. Any worth you have is because of me. You know you've won because my Son won. He suffered and died for you. You couldn't possibly have gone through what He did without cracking and forsaking me. If you want to feel successful, how about this—alleviate all the hunger, injustice, inhumanity, hatred, suffering, and misunderstanding in the world!"

"I can't do that!" we might say.

"Now you're beginning to understand," God might say. "I know you can't. But you can share my love with those around you. You can participate in some ways that will help alleviate some of the hunger, injustice, inhumanity, hatred, suffering, and misunderstanding in the world."

"That's what I told you in the beginning I was doing," we might say.

"Right", God might say, "but you were doing things with the idea of earning my respect and acknowledgment so you would feel successful. I want you to realize that success is in my hands. When you share my love in the name of my Son, you are beyond being concerned about whether you are successful. You give the results to me. Believe me, I will win!"

We are nearing completion with the window upgrades and repair with a second of five stained glass windows now in place. The ADA bathroom is complete and a welcome addition to our support facilities. The kitchen upgrade is complete except for the purchase and installation a new water heater. We presented a check to David

Bentz on August 28 in support of his seminary education. Work has begun on maintenance and repair for the parking lot. Except for the water heater expense, most of these projects have been at or below our original estimates which is good news for the projects "awaiting their turn" in the priority list. These activities have certainly been a blessing for our facility and provided opportunities for members to work together as a team to achieve fantastic results. Thanks all for your outstanding service!

Your council is entering the budget cycle for 2012 and reviewing programs and fixed-expenses to develop the budget framework that will allow us to continue to fulfill our mission of spreading, serving and sharing. We will be looking to the congregation for time, talent, and financial commitments that will allow us to maintain our presence in the community. This includes having some new Council members and volunteer committee members to keep our programs running. Please think about how you can continue to support St Luke's in the new year.

As we look at the west windows in Sanctuary we are once again thankful for the Blumhardt Memorial Fund and for Bernie Johansen for recommending such an accomplished craftsman to allow us to

have such unbelievable stained glass windows. One by one they are being installed and we are all awestruck by the absolute beauty of each of them.

On-Going Projects:

- Additional Yard Lights The four additional yard lights have been received and will be installed as soon as the Board has an opportunity. <u>Kitchen Work</u> – The Board has assisted the Blumhardt Kitchen Committee as noted.
- Garbage Disposal The installation was completed during the recent "All Members Work Day."
- 3. <u>Ice Maker</u> The cabinet modification and plumbing work, necessary for the installation of the ice maker has been completed. The ice maker installation is completed.
- Cook top Hood/Vent A new hood/vent cabinet has been constructed. The new cabinet and vent pipe will be installed by the Board as soon as time, and vacations, permit.

<u>Kitchen Hot Water Heater</u>: The Council approved the purchase and installation of a commercial water heater. The research has been completed, however, the work will not begin until the end of September due to vacation schedules.

<u>High Soffit Repair (Bird Issue)</u>: The Board decided that Bruce Kiser should perform the required work, a Blumhardt project, as soon as feasible.

Parking Lot Repair: The Board is in the process of updating the bid received about a year ago and obtaining additional bids for this Blumhardt project. Initial indications are that the costs will exceed the Blumhardt budget (\$6,000). Possibly, the budget can be augmented and/or the crack sealing (work currently included) can be postponed. The Board expects to have a recommendation soon.

<u>Plugged Storm Drains</u> - the poor drainage from various storm drain inlets has been investigated within the church property and it has been discovered that at least one pipe is nearly plugged. The City will be called to verify that the issue is **not a problem with the City's drainage system. It** is likely that clearing the storm drain pipes will be expensive (\$500 to \$1,000).

Tree Removal: The Board briefly discussed the removal of two trees – a large pine on the southeast corner of the sanctuary and a small old tree in the courtyard. Bids from one firm have been obtained and the Board is in the process of obtaining additional bids. The Board is primarily concerned with the large pine tree, as removal of the courtyard tree is likely to be included in the courtyard work.


Make these cheerful follipop cookies to share.





Monica is now going to school full time working the prerequisites for a degree in Dental Hygiene. Bethany has just turned 10 and started 4th grade last week. I'll keep you updated as I can as my journey continues.
