



Pick-A-Plot Program Re-Energized

Ever wonder why the planters around St. Luke's facilities are generally neat, clean, and **green**? The answer is, in part, that it is the result of the "Pick-A"

-Plot" program that was instituted by Bernie Johansen about eight years ago. At that time, Bernie was the Property Board chairperson, and she was seeking a means to maintain the planters – some, of which, do not have sprinklers and must be watered by hand – without increasing the duties of the landscape services contractor (and ultimately increasing costs).

Recently, the current Property Board realized that the Program needed to be reviewed and amended, as some of the plots have been eliminated or revised during the last eight years. In addition, a few caretakers expressed desires to be relieved of their duties, because of health or other issues. But, probably more importantly, the Program had become lost and needed to be re-energized.

Thus, in October, the Board reviewed, amended, and re-instituted the Program. Assignments of current caretakers were verified and new caretaker assignments were made as required. In addition, in effort to document the Program, a "Pick-A-Plot" binder was created that contains plot descriptions, plot photographs, caretaker guidelines, and currently assigned caretakers. This binder is kept in the office for reference by all.

The Property Board appreciates this relatively-small, but important effort, and thanks the currently assigned Pick-A-Plot caretakers – Carol/Jerry Carney, Linda/Mike Duffek, Jack/Micki Fenske, Dorothy Haney, Paul Heaton, Karen/Bruce Kiser, Peggy/Al Moser, and Brenda Sulzmann. These members are providing a valuable service that aids in keeping St. Luke's operating cost at a minimum.

Although there are too many individuals to list, the Board also would like to thank the caretakers who have faithfully served during the past eight years. Your efforts have been appreciated; thank you.

If you are interested in the "Pick-A-Plot' program and wish to become involved, contact a Property Board member. There is always room for additional assistance and the Board (and the caretakers) would welcome the added help.
