Pastoral Perspective



Why would God knit the most profound "spiritual realities" into such earthy stuff like water in Baptism and bread and wine or grape juice in Holy Communion? How can these elements give us Jesus and the salvation He brings? For many Christians down through the

years these questions have been a puzzle. Why did Christ institute the sacraments of Baptism and Holy Communion? Why should they occupy such a central place in the life of the church? Is not His word enough? For some, the sacraments are seen as merely symbols or reminders rather than real lifegiving gifts of God.

The truth is that during our years on earth we inhabit bodies that eat and drink, need washing and clothing and shelter, know pleasure and pain. Our bodies are very much with us and are interlocked with our spirits. They flavor our experiences. Our spirits are lifted by good food and comfortable clothes. They glow at a loved one's touch. If my daughter says, "I love you," that is one thing. If she gives me a loving hug that is another. The assurance of her love is reinforced by the physical. Her



word of love reaches my heart, in part, though my body. The experiences of our bodies can reinforce realities beyond our senses.

How would an ascended Lord, among us still but invisible, reinforce His word of love? How would He connect with the physical and wrap His arms around us so that we would know His love in our bodies? He does this through bread and wine or grape juice in Holy Communion and water in Baptism. These elements are not merely symbols or reminders of His love. The arms of my daughter are not merely symbols or reminders of her love—they carry her love; they hug me. The water, bread, and wine or grape juice are not vague symbols or reminders of Jesus' presence and love—they carry His presence and love; they hug me with His love.

The body and soul are both creations of God. Human disobedience separates both from the life of God. When Christ died to reconcile humankind to God and bridge the chasm between us, He died for the whole person, body and soul. When God raises us up. He will raise us whole with glorified, imperishable bodies like our Lord's, bodies that will be in full harmony with our spirits. We are connected bodily with the kingdom of heaven now by the water of Baptism and the bread and wine or grape juice of Holy Communion. When Jesus says, "This is my body given for you," we receive a real taste of that which is to come. When we are put under the Baptismal water, we are given now in our bodies an experience of oneness that we will have for eternity with the Lord. The

Lord gives to us in these physical ways reassurances of His eternal love.

So, as you have experienced Baptism, as you receive the bread and wine or grape juice in Holy Communion throughout your life—realize that the Lord is hugging you with His love now and eternally. That's what the sacraments are all about.




