Pastoral Perspective



We like to feel successful. We like people to respect us and acknowledge our efforts. We get the feeling that we are successful when we get a raise or a good grade or win in some competitive game. If we can string enough successes together, we can think of our-

selves as pretty great.

This desire to be successful can naturally become a part of our lives as followers of Jesus. We want the Lord to respect us for what good workers we are. We want him and others to acknowledge our efforts on His behalf. If we do enough for the Lord, we can begin to think of ourselves as pretty great.

This attitude can cause us problems in our relationship with the Lord. God might have to have a talk with us. "This is all well and good," He'll say, "but you have sort of missed the point. The reason it is important for you to do all the things you do to show my love for others is because I love them. When you do anything for others in the name of my Son, you are doing my work in the world. You have to get beyond yourself to be really successful in this work. Then anything you do, even the seemingly little things, are always successful in extending my kingdom of love.

"You see, I love you. I received you long ago when

my Son died on the cross for you. Because of that there isn't anything to come between us except that you sometimes misunderstand what that means. My Son's death and resurrection means that you are accepted, I give you new life in my love. When you do something in His name, you are doing it with the realization and trust that He will make that action meaningful. Then you aren't trying to prove yourself as great. Instead, you are simply helping to further my kingdom of love."

"I guess that makes sense," we will reply, "but how am I supposed to feel successful? How can I know whether I've won or lost?"

Then God will certainly respond, "Who do you think you are? I formed you out of dust. I preserve you. Any worth you have is because of me. You know you've won because my Son won. He suffered and died for you. You couldn't possibly have gone through what He did without cracking and forsaking me. If you want to feel successful, how about this—alleviate all the hunger, injustice, inhumanity, hatred, and suffering in the world!"

"I can't do that!" we will proclaim.

"Now you're beginning to understand," God will explain. "I know you can't. But you can share my love with those around you. You can participate in some ways that will help alleviate some of the hunger, injustice, inhumanity, hatred, and suffering in

the world."

"That's what I told you in the beginning I was doing," we will say.

"Right," God will respond, "but you were doing things with the idea of earning my respect and acknowledgment so you would feel successful. I want you to realize that success is in my hands. When you share my love in the name of my Son, you are beyond being concerned about whether you are successful. You give the results to me. Believe me, I will win!"

St. Luke's Lutheran Church Confirmation Program: "Confirmed In The Word"

I am very excited about the Confirmation material, "Confirmed In The Word." In two school years, it will give your student a solid undergirding of Biblical faith for life. This school year (September—May), we will consider the Old Testament in depth by discussing about seventy Old Testament passages. Next school year, we will consider the New Testament in depth by discussing about seventy New Testament passages.

I will lead the discussion each Sunday from 12 to 12:45 PM in the Youth Room (the room behind Schultz Hall). We will usually discuss two passages

each Sunday. I will email the material to be discussed beforehand for those who would like to consider it ahead and for those who

will be missing the next class session. If a student misses a class session, I will count on a parent or mentor to discuss the material missed with the student and sign the discussion sheet so I can be assured each student has discussed each unit.

At the end of the second school year, those students who have discussed all the units in class or with a parent or mentor will be eligible for Confirmation. Confirmation is a very special event when each student states publically that he or she desires and promises to make the faith in which they have been brought up theirs for life. It is accompanied by the blessing of the Holy Spirit and a celebration by the congregation.

All 6th graders and above are invited to take part in this program. They don't have to be members of St. Luke's to take part. Please contact me for more information and registration material. Classes will start Sunday, September 18.


FALL FESTIVAL

SEPTEMBER 11 SERVICE

Sunday, September 11, 2016, is the 15th anniversary of the terrorist attack on the Twin Towers in New York in which so many police and firefighters lost their lives saving others. On that day, ELCA congregations throughout the nation will be focusing on First Responders.



In the August issue of the News & Views, Larry Dockter posted an interesting and detailed article on the 17th annual Fireworks Sale fundraiser. Again this year, our sales broke records, and nearly \$10,000 was raised. As most of you are aware, all the money raised is used to maintain and improve St. Luke's facilities. Without these funds, the St. Luke's facilities would quickly fall into disrepair and sooner or later become unusable (e.g., one year, a main water line had to be repaired).

However, Larry left out part of the story. And that is his continuing dedication and knowledge devoted to this effort. Larry has been chair of the Fireworks Committee for many recent years. As chair, not only does Larry take a week off from his day job to spend seven 12-hour days in the hot sun, he

also attends pre- and post-sale meetings, arranges for transporting the fireworks, supervises pre- and post-sale inventories, and ensures there is sufficient help to meet the needs, including safety needs.

Larry has three equally dedicated individuals to assist him: Dorothy Haney, Peggy Moser, and Ron Webb. This steady group of four ensures that the fireworks fundraiser is a success each year, as it was once again this year.

Thus, on behalf of the congregation, the Property Board sends a big THANK YOU to Larry, Dorothy, Peggy, and Ron for their enduring dedication to this invaluable fundraiser effort.

This article would be incomplete if it did not note that the Fireworks Sale (as well as the Crab Feed fundraiser) was originated by Jennifer and Phillip Connell, some 17 years ago. At that time, Phillip was chair of the Property Board, and he quickly discovered there was not sufficient money available to complete the needed repairs. He also noted that the facilities were aging and falling into disrepair. So, the Connells adopted the fundraiser ideas utilized at their daughter's school and initiated St. Luke's fireworks and crab feed efforts to raise the needed funds. And the rest is history.

Thus, on behalf of the congregation, the Property Board also thanks Jennifer and Phillip for envisioning and implementing the Fireworks Sales to resolve an ongoing funding issue. From those humble beginnings, the gross fireworks sales have grown from a "hopeful" level of \$10,000 to the current level of \$30,000.




