the Greeters on Sunday Mornings. Thank you Joyce. If anyone would like to serve as a Greeter please call Joyce at 916-500-3264.







LENTEN SOUP SUPPERS AND SERVICES




Lutheran Good Gifts: We're going to buy an

Our 17th Annual Crab Feed was a SUPER success! We had a great turn out with just over 200 people in attendance and almost 60 volunteers working the event.




