Many years ago, I gashed my head on an open cupboard door. No stiches, no band-aids, only super glue. The Physicians Assistant who patched me up had a wonderful time trying to slide her fingers off the wound without reopening it because the super glue stuck to her gloves. This accident was a sad interruption of my "normal" Friday night I would have enjoyed yet I spent it in a trauma unit of a big hospital with the local tragedies all around.

Here we are with November in front of us and as much as we would like the encroachment of COVID to relent its grip on our "normal" life the sticky fingers keep holding on to us. We are practicing our survival and reshaping during this global trauma and reforming of our health, economies, politics, and faith lives. Schools are still adjusting; Christmas shopping is disrupted by supply chain issues, and we are being told to brace for another surge. What is "normal" or what is the "new normal?" Our Bishop tells us we have more than a third of congregation in our Synod undergoing a transition of one sort or another. (And they haven't visited all 180 yet!)

We rise from our difficulties, and we confess resurrection out of death. Look in this newsletter and see the works that are rising again, see also the opportunities for our rising. We are winding down the church year a little ahead of our calendar year and we have much serious work to do. But we also see return to traditions and new traditions coming our way. Read through this newsletter and find the thing that



reminds all of us of the "normal" and find the places we at St Luke's can stand into, there are many. Find also the opportunities of what we are becoming, faithful, hopeful, raised.

As a community rooted in Christ, we know that life goes on, and in our sustaining together we become the gift of God acting into this world. How our lives go on, what we choose to live for, what we will put our energies into, will be our faithfulness, an expression of who God has made us. As one season, cycle, or rhythm transitions to the next I ask us all to earnestly consider how we will be standing together as God's people in this place.



#### **Comments:**

- a. The Budget for each month is determined based on its percentage of the annual Budget as calculated by previous year's data. Historically, September through December is a period of elevated offerings. This factor combined with less-thanaverage offerings this month creates a September's offering that is 33 percent (\$5,000+) below Budget.
